### Angelina-Neches Forks Trip Canceled

**There will be no Angelina-Neches Forks trip October 8-10.** When the government administers an area, you have to expect decisions will be made because somebody sitting at a desk somewhere thinks it will look more like he's doing his job if he issues edicts. 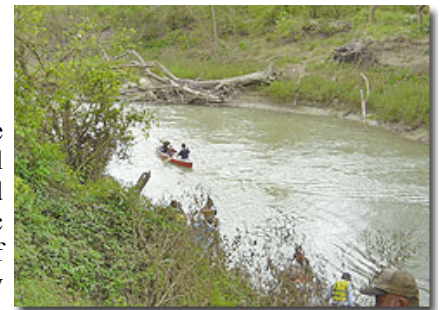

This project has the support of the San Antonio River Authority and TPWD, which should have representatives joining the trip. They have been active for a couple of years promoting the Trail as a nature tourism generator and for love of their own river. Two years ago we took them and local dignitaries on a float to view their river, which can link the town square, the State Historic Area and the put-ins, and makes a loop with an existing hike bike trail. Pretty sophisticated stuff for a little town in South Texas. If you have some time, this effort is worthy of support by showing a good out of town presence on this trip.





TPWD will run driver shuttles all morning 9:00am until noon to the Hwy 59 crossing above Goliad. This makes for about a nice 6 ½ mile float down to the State Park. It's basically flat water, clear channel, with lush vegetation and some surprising rock cliffs and outcroppings. We will likely stop at the town square near the river at the Ferry street landing to show how paddlers can support the local economy.

The Alamo City Rivermen will be meeting at the Hwy 59 put-in up river from Goliad at 10:00am. Right now, plan on packing a lunch for the float. We will be taking out at the state park. I will be reserving some campsites on the river for those who would like to stay overnight Saturday (recommended). We will not be cooking as we usually do, but will drive in to the local Mexican restaurant to show support for the local economy. We will then return to the park and stoke up the campfire for a night of tall tales and exaggerations. We will try to see if we can get some of the local folks or park rangers to come and tell us the tales of the ghosts that supposedly haunt the nearby mission and presidio, ephemera of its sometimes violent past. Ooooooohh.



The next morning we will get up and walk along the really cool riverside boardwalk trail into town and grab breakfast at the cafe on the town square. This boardwalk literally overhangs the river, quite a thing for a little town. This is a really easy trip suitable for beginners. Or you can do this as a day paddle, as SA is only 2 hours away. 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## Turkey Trot Returns 2005

**The Turkey Trot's On!** After last year's washout due to the flood of '04 (this is getting monotonous, Flood of '98, flood of '02, etc.), the ACR Turkey Trot returns to the Colorado River, Friday, Nov. 26 through Sunday Nov. 27, 2005. This year we will be floating a slightly different stretch. As always, enjoy Thanksgiving with family and friends and then put in with us the next day for a relaxing three day float down this central Texas river.



We will paddle from Big Webberville Park between Austin and Bastrop down to our takeout at Fisherman's Park in Bastrop. The distance is approximately 28 miles. This trip is really nice this time of year. The weather has usually blessed us with pleasant days and cool nights, and the tree lined bluffs are usually at their height of autumn color change. And we'll always be hoping for that bald eagle sighting as in past years, but I would be surprised if we get one on this stretch. This trip is primarily flatwater, with riffle rapids only, suitable for beginners. Everyone will have to be self contained, as we will overnight camp on inaccessible islands. We will meet at 9:00am Friday on the 26th at Big Webberville Park, off Park Lane off Webberville Drive west of FM 969 on the east bank of the Colorado. There we will drop canoes and shuttle vehicles down to Fisherman's Park in Bastrop, where we will leave them at the park.

Neil Cook of Cook's canoes will provide a driver's shuttle. There will be a fee. Depending on turnout, this may take two trips. Cook's canoes will be able to provide canoes, paddles and pfd's to anyone needing a canoe, at the cost of \$30.00 total for the three days. This trip will be suitable to those with primarily flatwater skills, but at places there may be sweepers to avoid and tight bends to negotiate. You must provide all other gear necessary for two nights of camping. Fishing will also be a possibility.

We will be spending two nights on the river, with takeout planned Sunday afternoon at Fisherman's Park in Bastrop. The day we will do approximately 6 miles to our first island. The second day will be a long one, approximately 16 miles, and we will camp on Freeze Trip island. The last day should be only about 6 miles again. As always, we will Dutch oven cook the 2 night meals. The first will be shrimp etouffee with garlic bread, including the catch of the day, and the other to be decided. All other meals are on your own.

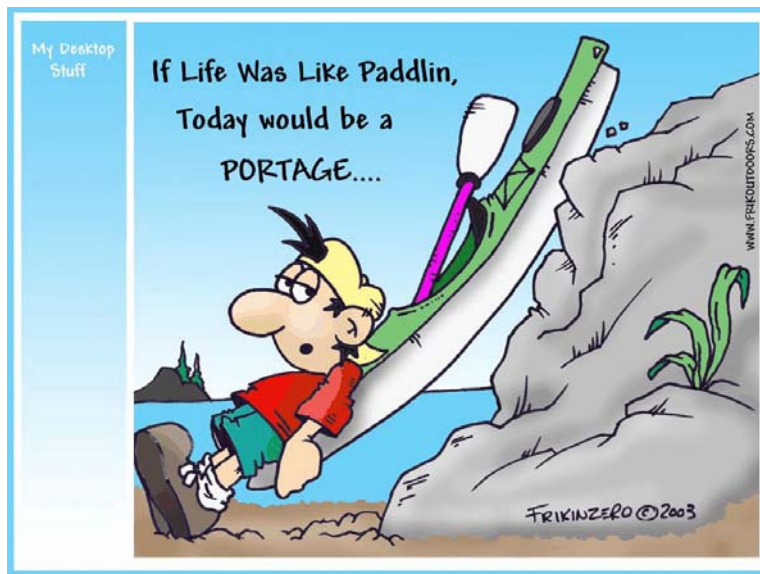
You will need to have all your own camping gear. Everyone should come ready to help with wood gathering, food prep, cooking, and cleanup for the night meals. In addition, we will ask that you help carry some of the groceries and charcoal. There will be a trip fee to cover shuttle fees, the two dinners, taxes, titles, and license. I will have this pinned down in the next newsletter, but probably not more than \$30. Everyone will have to pay for both meals whether you eat or not, so meal planning can be simplified. In the meantime, I will need to get your name, email, and phone number if you are intending to go to help with meal planning.

If you do not have a boat but have the gear and would like to do this trip, Cook's Canoes in Webberville can provide one for you. You will have to rent your own boat and make your own arrangements and payments. Tell them that you are with our group if you rent. We have a group discount. I will have their number in the next newsletter. If you are renting a canoe, please let me know, as he may throw in a driver's shuttle for the rest of us. I also need to know if you have a dutch oven, charcoal chimney or two burner stove that you can bring. This is usually a great trip, and hope you can make it.
